Â Simulacra: plural of simulacrum

A simulacrum is a Latin word originally meaning a material object representing something (such as an idol representing a deity, or a painted still-life of a bowl of fruit). According to the modern meaning "simulacra" are natural elementsÂ formed in a shape similar to a symbol. The cause of this effect probably differs among cases, but still covers with mystery every Simulacrum in the world.

Santorini is full of Simulacra. The volcanic earth of the island has in many cases strange formed rocks. Big or smaller shaping of rocks picture symbols, figures, objects.

Skaros is the biggest and most famous simulacrum of the Island. A great rock standing at the edges of caldera, reminding a gurdian watching his area.

Skaros isÂ located in Imerovigli but it is so great, it is visible from Fira and Oia.

The rock has a great view to the sunset,Â many crypts and the sign: "The area is holy".

In Vlihada you can find such shapings on the dark rock along the beach.
